

The Cotter Charitable Trust Year 9 Scholarship Regulations

The Cotter Charitable Trust has been established to provide financial and pastoral support to students to enable them to access high quality secondary education.

The Cotter Trust Provides an entry scholarship valued at \$1500 per year over a five year tenure (subject to annual review) for one or more Year 9 students.

Regulations:

- 1. All applicants for scholarships and funding must be either NZ citizens or permanent residents.
- 2. Trustees will determine the amount to be awarded for each scholarship and the tenure of the scholarship.
- 3. Trustees will determine how and when payments for the scholarships will be made.
- 4. Recipients of Scholarships awarded by the Cotter Charitable Trust will be required to furnish a written report on their work during the year and submit to the Trustees copies of their school reports.
- 5. Trustees may at any time suspend or terminate a scholarship if they are satisfied that a scholarship recipient is not working diligently or has failed to comply with any of the expressed or implied terms and conditions by which the scholarship was awarded.
- 6. The Scholarships shall be awarded by the Trustees on the recommendation of a Selection panel consisting of at least three of the Trustees.
- 7. The Trustees have the right, at all times, to rescind, vary or add to these regulations.



The COTTER CHARIBLE TRUST YEAR 9 ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

The Cotter Charitable Trust has been established by Don and Margaret Cotter at the time of the 125th Anniversary of Auckland Girls' Grammar School to provide financial and pastoral support to students at Auckland Girls' Grammar School.

The Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of financial and/or family need to a candidate of high academic potential who also exhibits qualities such as leadership, community involvement, and sporting or cultural abilities.

The scholarship will potentially be awarded for each of the five years that the student attends Auckland Girls' Grammar School, subject to annual review.
